WELCOME TO 2017

I hope that all our families enjoyed the blessings of Christmas and had safe travels and an enjoyable summer with their children over January. Whilst most staff and families enjoyed the break, many teachers at MacKillop were involved in academic study, professional travel and writing, and evaluation and preparation for the 2017 academic year. I'm sure many of you will agree that it was disappointing that a Federal Member of Parliament chose to make fun of holidays for teachers and to cynically misrepresent long holidays as a time exclusive to relaxation and not much of the work that goes on. Congratulations to the Prime Minister's daughter, Daisy Turnbull (herself a teacher), who spoke out, along with others, in defence of the profession.

Staff members have been back for well over a week engaged in Archdiocesan-wide conferences and professional learning specifically targeted to the school's annual improvement plan and to preparation for the new year.

Welcome to the new staff who have joined us for 2017. Extensive advertising, thorough interviewing, and referee checks were in place to secure the very best teachers we can to teach your children. I'm very excited about the range of talent and ability that they will bring to our community.

NEW COLLEGE FACILITIES

Whilst the new furnishings are still in transit, students and staff returned to the Isabella Campus to a \$400,000 refurbishment of the Isabella Library. The removals of walls, partitions, and doors, rewiring of electrical and cable, carpet and paint and furniture have significantly improved this facility for student learning. Isabella families will be able to see the facility at the Parent Info Sessions over the next few weeks. More work will be done in the April holidays which will significantly expand teaching and learning spaces for Year 12.

The Isabella Campus will also be home to extensive building of the classroom block and the Fr Julian Tenison Woods Centre for Scientific Enquiry (it will be fabulous!), which will be completed this year. Work has already commenced on these buildings at the back of the campus, which will be completed without disruption to student learning. The Theatrette on the junior campus will also be refurbished this term – a long overdue project!

WELCOME TO YEAR 7 2017

Whilst it is my intention to survey Year 7 prior to the Year 7 Parent Information Session next Tuesday, anecdotal evidence (me talking to them) suggests that their entry into high school at MacKillop has been a raging success. Teacher comments, such as "what a lovely group," are commonplace in staff offices and the enthusiasm from the students is what we have come to expect and provide for from Year 7. Congratulations to first time parents who have negotiated the drop off and pickup process on the Wanniassa Campus!

HT Update

Bring Your Own Device

The BYOD program enables a student to bring their own tablet or computer (laptop, iPad, android, netbook etc.) to school for the purpose of learning. BYOD allows for diverse and flexible learning styles in and out of the classroom.

All students in Years 8 - 10 are invited to be part of a Hybrid BYOD program. Students have a choice; to bring an appropriate device to assist with their learning or continue using their College-provided laptop.

If families opt to BYOD, the student must hand in the College provided laptop to the IT Support Office, located in the library. A Laptop Return Receipt will be signed by a member of the IT Support team and given to the student to confirm that the laptop has been returned. Students will be responsible for any personal device that they bring to school and will be required to read and sign the Personal Electronic Device Acceptable Use agreement before using their device at school.



Term 1 Fees and how to pay

Term 1 fee statements should be received by next week. Fees are to be paid by 3 March 2017 unless paying by Direct Debit or other approved instalment payment method.

PAYMENTS BY QKR!

All payments to the College can now be made through the Qkr! app. Payments for school fees, excursions and tours etc can all be made using Qkr! Details on how to download and register the App are available on our website.

CASH & EFTPOS

Cash and Eftpos payments may be made in person at both Isabella and Wanniassa Front Reception.

BPAY

Bpay is available at the College for payment of School Fees only. Payments can be made through internet and telephone banking by quoting the Biller Code and Reference Number located on your school fee statement.

DIRECT DEBIT

Payment of School Fees by Direct Debit will require completion of the relevant paperwork. Please contact Jayne Limbrick via email, jayne.limbrick@mackillop.act.edu. au to set up your Direct Debit. Direct Debits usually commence in January and run over 52 weeks or 26 fortnights.

All Direct Debits are to be altered in December for the following year's School Fees.

College Counselling Service

As part of their pastoral care program for students, Catholic Schools have access to a Student and Family Counselling service provided by CatholicCare Canberra & Goulburn (CCG). CCG are contracted by Catholic Education and Congregational Schools to provide a counselling service to students and their families. There is no fee to access this service.

St Mary MacKillop College provides counselling services to all students and families within the school. Three counsellors, employed by CatholicCare, work across both campuses.

The counsellors have contact with students regarding a range of issues and for varying lengths of time. Some students may only require a one off meeting; others may be engaged over weeks, terms or even years.

Some typical concerns that counsellors work with include: anger, anxiety, behavioural problems, depression, eating problems, family breakdown and family conflict, grief and loss, learning and educational challenges, parenting challenges, peer and other social relationships, school avoidance, stress and study skills. As well as individual sessions with students, counsellors can run groups, do family work, consult with parents and teachers and make referrals to other services and supports.

Counsellors are not employed as specialists in any area and at times will suggest referrals for specialist services. Counsellors also do not provide cognitive or learning assessments or court reports. Families requiring these will be referred to another service.

All Student and Family counsellors are professionally qualified Social Workers or Psychologists who participate in regular clinical supervision and professional development. Student and Family Counsellors subscribe to a set of professional ethics that include duty of care and respect for the individual's right to privacy and confidentiality. The counsellors' obligation is to ensure the safety, wellbeing and confidentiality of the student they are working with. All counsellors are mandated to report any disclosure or sign of abuse (including self-harm) or neglect to Child Protection Services.

BOOKING AN APPOINTMENT

Students can make an appointment to see a counsellor by filling out a slip available either from student reception or from outside the counselling offices, and returning it either directly to us or to student reception. Offices are located at the end of the corridor to the left of student reception at Wanniassa, and in C block at Isabella.

Alternatively, teachers, coordinators and parents are all welcome to make a referral for counselling on behalf of a student. However, the student must provide consent before the referral can be made. Parents are also welcome to contact the counsellors directly if they have any concerns or wish to discuss their child.

At times, there can be a waiting period of up to two weeks for initial appointments. However, we always endeavour to see students as soon as possible and prioritise urgent cases.

Privacy and Confidentiality

Contact with counsellors is carried out in a way that ensures as much privacy for students and families as possible. All contact with a school counsellor is confidential, and no information is discussed with parents, friends or teachers unless permission is given by the student, or the counsellor has serious concerns about the safety of the client. This will be discussed in more detail at the first meeting with the counsellor.

This year we have altered our assessment program such that students have three final pieces to submit over the course of the semester. We are focussing our attention on inquiry-based learning; class content and formative assessment is centred on engaging students and developing students' questioning, researching, reading and writing skills. It's a change in direction which fulfils all the requirements of BSSS and the new Australian curriculum, while easing the pressure on students regarding assessment burdens and increasing the need for student attendance to all classes.

Students' academic development and wellbeing are important to us and as such I would like to take a moment to bring three key essential services to your attention.

Ms Marilyn Veech: our teacher-librarian is an excellent resource for students wishing to start any information gathering activity. Ms Veech can teach students how to access databases, how to narrow searches on the internet and most importantly assist students in identifying which pieces of information are relevant for the occasion.

Mrs Petrina Mansfield is our Learning Commons teacher and is located in the library to assist any student seeking her attention. Mrs Mansfield is especially skilled in helping students access tasks, break them down to the foundation, and guide students in beginning the task in a structured manner.

Of course, the **classroom teacher** is always available to assist students and can meet at mutually convenient times. We offer a weekly afterschool **tutorial service** and students are invited to attend tutorials for assistance with assessment items and classroom content. The schedule for the tutorials is posted in the IRC, in each of the teaching blocks, and on the B Block (English) notice board.
