Vale Margaret Whitlam 1919 – 2012

Few students will know much about Margaret Whitlam or indeed about her husband or the early 1970s when they were so prominent. The black and white images of her that flashed across TV screens since her death on the weekend reminded many of us of a remarkable and influential woman who was an unfailing advocate for women, education, the arts, and the progress of Australian life for all.

She was a woman of extraordinary influence who, whilst never universally agreed with, was certainly admired. She came from that group of Australian women who had a notionally advantaged upbringing, a university education, became a wife and mother of four who raised her children whilst her husband was frequently away in Canberra.

She emerged in the 1970s as a clear common sense voice on the side of what she saw as social progress. She heralded an example of a thoroughly modern woman.

Margaret Whitlam’s advocacy helped to make life easier for the woman of succeeding generations. This is a good thing. Her passing gives us a cause to pause and reflect upon a life well lived for her family, herself, and for others.

Margaret Whitlam, may her memory be blessed.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN: 15 - 17 May

In 2012 the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) testing will be held from 15th-17th May. For all schools in the ACT these dates correspond with Tuesday-Thursday of Week 13. NAPLAN testing is the annual national assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9.

The data obtained from NAPLAN testing is utilised by our school to enrich our teaching and learning for the benefit of all students in our community. The more students we have participating in NAPLAN testing the greater the benefit for our College when implementing the available data in our teaching and learning programs.

If your son or daughter has special needs, or requires special provisions during their classroom learning, special provisions will be provided to reflect the support he or she would usually receive in the classroom. If you have any concerns regarding the support provided, please contact the Faculty Co-ordinator for Inclusive Education, Mrs Lenore Moore, or the College NAPLAN Co-ordinator.

If you wish to withdraw your son or daughter from all aspects of NAPLAN testing, you may do so; signed parent/carer consent forms are required and are available from the College NAPLAN Co-ordinator.

Students in Years 7 and 9 will receive a NAPLAN 2012 Information for Parents brochure through their Pastoral Care class in the coming week. School Funding

MySchool Data

Please see the attached letter from the National Catholic Education Commission regarding funding for Catholic Schools. The NCEC aims to inform parents about the need for greater investment in Catholic school education.

Latest school data heightens need for greater investment in school education

On the 24th of February the latest round of school funding data was published on the government's *My School* website.

The *ACARA My School* data identifies the amount of money each school in Australia received in 2010 for their day-to-day operations from all sources—Commonwealth and state governments and parent contributions—and provides an insight into the relative resources of all schools.

According to the data, government schools operate on average at around \$11,520 per student and Catholic schools with around \$10,340 per student.

Simply put, even when parent contributions are taken into account, Catholic schools receive on average around 10% less money for their day-to-day operations than government schools.

This means that Catholic schools continue to be the least resourced of all Australian schools.

While Catholic schools continue to deliver high quality education, doing 'more with less' is not sustainable into the future.

The recently released Gonski Report on Funding for Schooling identified that if Australia is to keep up with world standards than government investment in school education needs to increase by \$5 billion per annum.

The Catholic education sector has strongly backed the call for more investment in education and the latest *My School* data strengthens the need for this to happen sooner rather than later.

On behalf of all our Catholic schools, the National Catholic Education Commission (NCEC) will be continuing efforts in the coming months to work with all governments to promote the urgent need for more funding for schools.

Only with additional investment by governments, will all school sectors be able to continue to deliver quality education for all Australian students.
