Thank you Bishop Mark, your care for this school and its community has been deeply appreciated and will not be quickly forgotten.


#### Early events in Term 2

## RE News

### Religious Education News

The primary text used in Religious Education classes is the 'Holy Bible more specifically the New Revised Standard Version Bible with Deuterocanonicals. Bibles are listed on the book pack as an essential requirement at a cost of \$14.95 and are available from Chalk Education (62983055).

There is an expectation that each student in Years 7 – 10 has a bible of their own that is brought to IHum/RE classes and can be taken home to assist with assignments. In term 1 Year 7 have been studying scripture from both the Old Testament and the New Testament, Year 8 'The Parables', Year 9 have been studying 'The Prophets' from the Hebrew scriptures and Year 10 'The Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes'. In Term 2, Year 7 will continue to study scripture from both the Old Testament and the New Testament, Year 8 will focus on the 'Acts' that is the 'Acts of the Apostles' and Year 9 on Luke's gospel.

The College has some class sets of bibles and the NRSV Bible is available on line; however, learning to use, navigate and read the bible is best done the old fashioned way, actually reading from the good book.

### Seasons for Growth

Seasons for Growth is a program for young people who have experienced significant change or loss. It is based on the belief that change, loss and grief are a normal and valuable part of life. We examine the impact of changes such as death, separation, divorce, and natural disaster upon our lives, and explore how we can learn to live with and grow from these experiences.

The program is educational in nature and does not provide therapy. We use the imagery of the four seasons to illustrate that grief is cyclical, not a linear journey. Trained "Companions" facilitate small groups where participants share experiences, and support one another. Peer support is a key element of the program; confidentiality is strongly emphasised.

MacKillop has offered Seasons for Growth for many years now and would again like to invite any student who might like to be involved in this program to collect a note from their Pastoral Care Coordinator or Student Reception. The program will begin in about Week 6 of Term 2 and concludes in Term 3. It runs during normal school hours. Anyone that may like to have a chat about what is involved is welcome to contact Helen Maybin at the Wanniassa Campus.
