St Mary MacKillop College has had students participating in ANU Secondary College courses since its inception seven years ago. Students in Years 11 and 12 have the opportunity of undertaking classes in Physics, Chemistry, Conservation Biology, Specialist Maths and Continuing Japanese.

At the beginning of Year 11, students complete an exam in their area of expertise. If selected, students then study their course during Terms 2, 3 and 4 in Year 11 and Terms 1, 2 and 3 in Year 12. Students who undertake these courses are gifted academically as they are able to complete courses equivalent to first-year university whilst completing their studies at school.

Students who participate in these courses have always shown themselves to be motivated, enthusiastic and keen to do well. Currently we have six students in Year 12 who have just completed courses at ANU secondary College and another three currently in Year 11. The six Year 12 graduates are: Parker Blakey, Meaghan Jones, Liam Pitt, Jack Anderson, Dominic Illidge, and Mark Harris.

The College congratulates all these students for the extra work and effort that they put into their studies. Year 12 is not easy and to be studying an extra minor is a great achievement. Students who achieve at a distinction level at ANU Secondary College are automatically offered a place in their course of choice at ANU.
