Year 10 swimmer Rebecca Cross has had a lot of success over the years, and 2015 turned out to be her best year yet, after she was selected in the Junior Australian Talent ID Squad, which aims to prepare swimmers for the 2020 Olympic games.

Three MacKillop students represented Australia at the Indoor Cricket World Series during the October school holidays, with Adam Seary of Year 11 becoming MacKillop's latest World Champion.

Thomas Seaman (Year 10) and Tyler Hays (Year 9) represented Australia A in their respective age groups, while Seary and former MacKillop student Benji Floros helped steer the Australian Under-18 side to victoru.

Seary played an important role for the Aussies, with his batting performance in the final setting the platform for Australia's successful run chase against South Africa.

"It was one of the best feelings I've ever had in my life, there was so much emotion put into the ten days and to come out on top was really good," Seary said.

"My goal was to get picked in the Top 8 for the Australian team and play the final, and to be able to represent my country in the final and win was a areat honour."

Hays (U16) and Seaman (U18) also enjoyed success in the tournament, with Haus' performances against the other Australian side and Seaman's two victories over eventual finalists South Africa among their biggest highlights.

The World Series in Brisbane became the second time Hays had represented his nation after he and his team won the U12 World Cup


