Congratulations and thank you to everyone involved with what was again a highly successful event for the College. From my point of view, it is such a privilege to have about 1500 people visit the College to find out more about us, to compare us to other schools, and to show genuine interest in the opportunity to have their children here.

Again, the stars of the show were Year 7 and Year 12 2012, who addressed the crowd, conducted tours, talked about curriculum, and were impressive and reassuring. Well over 70 Year 12 students gave up part time employment, sporting commitments, study, and commitment to families to be part of the event; this is typical of the generosity of the year group.

The staff magnificently presented their subject area in engaging and stimulating ways and showed off the new facilities of the College to their best advantage.

I think the MacKillop community is rightly proud of what we have here at our school. Strong bonds of friendship, relationships of mutual respect, students with high self-esteem that comes from knowing that their school values them and holds them in affection, and high-quality teaching are what MacKillop is all about. Our students like coming to school and willingly tell anyone who listens that this is a great place to be.

The College has slightly reduced its promotions budget this year and is keen to rely more on the positive word of mouth by members of our community promoting the school more broadly. Already I have conducted about 50 enrolment interviews for Year 7, and the key point of interest of the prospective families is that they know people here who are happy and successful.

Thank you to everybody who speaks well of the school and helps to ensure that this school is recognised as a place of quality learning, Catholic values and ethos, and which is welcoming of anyone wishing to join us.

In past years, late applications have not been able to be considered and have gone to a waiting list. Please ensure that this unfortunate disappointment is avoided this time.

Cyber Safety

Cyber Safety at MacKillop

In Term 2 as a part of the Pastoral Program in Year 7 to 9 students will be focussing on the theme of Safe Behaviours and Well-Being. An aspect of this will include a Cyber Safety presentation delivered by the Australian Federal Police. St Mary MacKillop College has a very positive relationship with the AFP and we work closely together to promote a safe and secure learning environment for our students.

Year 9 students had their presentation last week. The presentation for Year 7 and Year 8 will also be delivered through the AFP by their Crime Prevention, High Tech Crime Operations and will take place on the following dates:

Year 8 - June 6

Year 7 - July 4

These presentations cover aspects such as the law, protecting your reputation, cyber bullying, use of social media and mobile phones.

Information for Parents

Keeping kids safe in a cyber world is now a significant issue. Parents should use the same offline preventative strategies to maximise their children's online safety that they have always used. These strategies include: teaching children about the right way to behave online; don't let them spend all night in the cyber world; and ask questions about what they are doing and where they go online.

The more parents know about cyber safety, the more empowered they are to protect their children. Below are two sources of information that parents may find useful.

A short video, "How Cybersmart are you?" has been released by Cybersmart. The video is designed to help parents navigate through the online world of their teenagers and provides methods on how to protect their children from potential online risks. The 5 min video contains up to date statistics, explains online risks for children and more importantly, the best strategies for parents to keep their children safe online.

Parents urged to remember cyber-safety

Aussie school kids are more connected than ever with new Telstra research revealing four in five parents will send their kids to school this year with an internet connected device. Telstra's Cyber-Safety survey of Australian parents with children

Telstra's Cyber-Safety survey of Australian parents with children aged 10 to 17 revealed almost eight in 10 children own a mobile by the time they are 13 and seven in 10 will take one to school this year.

The research also found that while school bags are increasingly packed with internet connected gadgets including mobiles, laptops and tablets, nine in 10 parents have concerns about

cyber-safety risks such as approaches from online strangers and cyber bullying.

Telstra's Officer of Internet Trust & Safety, Darren Kane, said it was important for parents to equip children with the skills required to use new technology safely as they pack their gadget-filled bags for the new school year.

"Our research found that parents' cyber safety concerns don't necessarily motivate them to prepare their kids for the digital schoolyard. Almost half of parents (45 per cent) admitted they haven't spoken to their children recently about how to handle approaches from cyber bullies and more that a third (37 per cent) haven't spoken to them about how to respond if a stranger approaches them online.

The Telstra research also revealed:

- While mobile phones and laptops are the most popular devices to take to class, one in three are returning to school with a Smartphone, while six per cent will take a tablet to school this year.
- Unsolicited contact by strangers is the single greatest cybersafety concern among parents (with 34 per cent citing it as their top concern) followed by cyber bullying (15.3%) and unsupervised access to information (14.7%)
- 31 per cent of parents haven't spoken to their children recently about how to protect personal information like photos, address details and passwords when online while 42 per cent of parents haven't spoken to their kids about who they should share their mobile number with.
