## Year 11 AST Practice Tests - Moderation Day

Year 11 Tertiary students who have indicated that they will be sitting the AST are reminded that they must attend the College for the next AST trial tests on Thursday 16 August. Students are expected to meet outside the gym no later than 9am. On this day we will be completing a full trial of Day 1 of the AST as follows:

Meet at 9:00 for Multiple Choice Test (9.30 – 11:45)

Lunch (12:00 – 12:45)

Meet at 12:45 for Short Response Test (1:15 – 3:00)

Students are required to bring the following items. Multiple Choice: Pencils (2B, B or HB), eraser, pencil sharpener, ID card. Short Response Test: Pens or biros, ruler (clean), ID card. They may also bring: Highlighter pens, dictionary in book form without a thesaurus (any language or bi-lingual), clear, unlabelled bottle of water. Students may NOT bring any other item especially: mobile phones, calculators of any kind, electronic devices (eg iPod), thesaurus, dictionaries with additional features, electronic dictionary of any kind, scanner pens, whiteout or equivalent, pens or biros (to Multiple Choice Test), bags or handbags, hats, food, etc.

We hope to provide students with a realistic experience of the day in order to ensure that they are confident in their preparation for the AST in Year 12.

## Year 12 AST Workshops

Students are reminded that as part of the planned student preparation for the ACT Australian Scaling Test (AST), the College will be conducting four workshops. The purpose of the workshops is to give students the skills and practice to approach the AST with confidence. The College believes that preparation and practice for the AST is a valuable part of maximizing student potential. Therefore, all students are expected to attend each of the four scheduled workshops.

Workshops will commence in Week 3 and will run until Week 6, 8am until 8.45am each morning in C Block. Workshops will be conducted in small groups of approximately 10 students. Students should bring a pen and note pad and their green Student Information Booklet.

Week 3: Workshop 1 - Admin requirements, writing task

Week 4: Workshop 2 - Short response (qualitative)

Week 5: Workshop 3 - Short response (quantitative)

Week 6: Workshop 4 - Multiple choice

## National self-detection program for Scoliosis

Scoliosis (spinal curvature) is an important health problem for adolescent girls and 25 per thousand are at risk of developing a significant curve. Three girls per thousand require active treatment (spinal brace or surgery). Because in the early stages the condition is most often asymptomatic, screening in the age range 11-13 years is a sound preventative health measure. When school screening for scoliosis was abandoned the Spine Society of Australia introduced the self-detection program as a practical alternative.

July and August are the months when parents of girls in Years 7-9 are encouraged to download the Self-Detection Brochure and participate in the self-detection program.
