### Congratulations to Victoria Pfitz (Year 10)

Earlier this semester, students in Years 8 and 10 participated in the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) English Competition. ICAS are developed annually for primary and secondary school students in the subject areas of Computer Skills, English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing. Over one million student entries are accepted from over 6,300 schools in Australia and New Zealand annually.

Students read a variety of texts which narrate, describe, explain, argue, persuade and review. The types of texts include extracts from picture books, novels, poems, play scripts, transcripts of interviews, letters, diary entries, advertisements, webpages, feature articles, opinion pieces and comics. These texts cover a range of topics and may include tables, diagrams, maps and other visual information.

This year the College received a number of distinction and credit awards, however, Victoria Pfitz achieved 99% on the English paper which places her in the top 1% of students in Year 10 in the ACT and NSW. Victoria received her high distinction certificate at a Ceremony held at the University of NSW on Friday 23 November. I was happy to attend the ceremony with Victoria's parents.

## Mackillop receives MindMatters Award

Thirteen schools from around the country were officially recognised for their work in promoting mental health in the classroom and schoolyard at a recent MindMatters National Recognition Event.

Year 11 Leaders Morgan Rosin, Nathan Backer and Daniel Dwyer and member of St Mary MacKillop MindMatters Core Team Planning Group, Romina Mamone, received the Recognition Award at the ceremony held at Rydges Lakeside.

Peter Garrett, Minister for School Education, Early Childhood and Youth, opened the awards ceremony and presented the awards. The event also had the support of Minister for Education, Mark Butler.

"MindMatters does some incredibly important work with schools and we now have over 80% of high schools across Australia undertaking the program," said Mr Butler. "They are all doing extraordinary work showing innovation in the area of mental health."

MindMatters helps schools to promote and protect the mental health, resilience and social and emotional wellbeing of all the members of school communities. Statistics from surveys completed at MacKillop in July reflected the following:

Students:

- 78% agree or strongly agree that positive communications and relationships exist.
- 77% are encouraged to do their best and have high expectations of themselves
- 72% know where to find help for themselves or a friend at school
- 77% are encouraged to welcome and help new students.

Parents and Caregivers:

- 81% of parents agree the physical environment is conducive to positive health and wellbeing
- 82% agree their students have staff they can go to for help
- 91% feel welcome to visit the school
- 94% think their students feel safe at school
- 94% feel the school has clear expectations for student behaviour.

As part of our review of Pastoral programs from years 7-12, all teachers participated in a survey at Campus Meetings last week. Monthly Planning meetings of the Core Team Planning Group use all data to inform planning and progress. Parents and students are welcome to email their suggestions and insights. Our aim is to ensure an engaging and relevant pastoral program for our students.
